



















Non URGENT cases: Start treatment, 1-2 month follow up; Use Routine Eye Exam Slots

HORDEOLUM "STYE"	ALLERGIC	BILATERAL PAINFUL	Unilateral PAINLESS
<p>first episode or recurrent</p> <p>asymptomatic--> tender to touch --> mild pain</p>    <p>Antibiotic OINT BID or TID</p> <p>If Conjunctivitis, add Antibiotic GTTs</p> <p>Warm Compress</p> <p>If spreading, add Oral Antibiotic</p> <p>Follow up in 1 month</p>	<p>BILATERAL itchy/eye rubbers/watery</p> <p>No pain/sticky lids /mucous/staining</p>   <p>antihistamine eye drops + oral</p> <p>Start oral Benadryl qpm; Topical antihistamine eye drops + steroid cream FOR AROUND the eyes (not inside; AVOID eyes); to reduce itchy skin; FU in 1 month</p>	<p>stabbing pain; epiphora/tearing</p> <p>symptoms >>> signs</p> <p>Unknown Onset; Prolong onset</p> <p>GENERALIZED Photophobia (always sensitive to lights/glare)</p>  <p>Start GEL ointment qpm + Artificial Tears QID</p> <p>Follow up in 1 month</p>	 <p>Subconj Heme woke up with it</p>  <p>Pterygium Longstanding</p>  <p>foreign body sensation</p> <p>No exposure to chemicals/dust; Not construction worker / mechanic</p> <p>Start GEL ointment qpm + Artificial Tears QID</p> <p>Follow up in 1 month</p>

URGENT: Initiate Treatment and Call

UNILATERAL PAINFUL EYES

New Onset (SHORT duration)	Worsening symptoms	Symptoms WORSE than the eye looks
<p>Woke up with it</p>  <p>Abrasion stains</p>  <p>ULCERS stains</p>  <p>Herpes Stains</p> <p>1 day FU</p>	<p>Not responding to treatment</p>  <p>NEED ORALS</p>  <p>Antibiotic PO</p> <p>1 Day FU</p> <p>limbal or local injection can be a clue pointing you to something</p>	<p>Painful; Monocular Photophobia; Anisocoria; Excessive Tearing but NO DISCHARGE; No Significant Eyelid or Red eye; No Staining</p>  <p>Uveitis</p>  <p>Scleritis</p>  <p>Episcleritis</p>  <p>CL wearer</p> <p>Construction</p> <p>Trauma</p> <p>Chemical Exposure</p> <p>Foreign Body</p> <p>DO NOT put proparacaine if you suspect foreign body</p> <p>Wash eye if you can't see the f.b. (Saline SPRAY!)</p>
